PROF. LYDIA AZIATO REAPPOINTED AS VICE CHANCELLOR OF UHAS.



In a moment that resonates with pride across the nursing and midwifery fraternity, the University of Health and Allied Sciences (UHAS) has once again entrusted its highest leadership mantle to one of our own.

At a Special Governing Council Meeting held on Friday, November 21, 2025, the Council renewed the appointment of Professor Lydia Aziato as Vice Chancellor for an additional four-year term effective August 1, 2026 to July 31, 2030.

This decision followed a rigorous performance evaluation undertaken by two independent review committees constituted by the Council. Their reports unanimously affirmed what many in the profession already knew: Professor Aziato is a transformational leader with a rare blend of academic brilliance, integrity, and a forward-looking vision that continues to shape UHAS into a premier health sciences institution.

From her earliest days as a dedicated nurse to her rise as Ghana's first nurse to become a Vice Chancellor, Professor Aziato has embodied resilience, excellence, and purpose-driven leadership. Her reappointment is more than an institutional milestone it is a powerful symbol of what nurses and midwives can achieve when passion meets opportunity.

For the entire GRNMA family, this moment is deeply personal. It reflects our collective aspirations and reminds us that the nursing and midwifery professions hold immense potential not only in clinical spaces but also in academic, administrative, and national leadership.
