GRNMA SIGNS CONTRACT AGREEMENT WITH AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT BANK

On October 1, 2025, the Ghana Registered Nurses and Midwives Association (GRNMA) formalized a partnership with the Agricultural Development Bank (ADB) through a significant contract agreement. This partnership aims to provide crucial funding support for the GRNMA Loan Scheme, a flagship welfare initiative designed to alleviate the financial challenges faced by its members.

Purpose and Benefits of the Loan Scheme

The agreement guarantees that ADB will deliver a structured financing arrangement to ensure the Loan Scheme meets the rising demand for funds among nurses and midwives. Key features include:

- A maximum loan amount of GHC 400,000.00
- Affordable interest rates
- Flexible repayment periods

These terms are crafted to help members manage their financial needs responsibly and sustainably. Addressing Financial Barriers for Nursing Professional.

The timing of this partnership is critical as many financial institutions have blacklisted nurses and midwives from accessing loans. This exclusion results from the increasing migration of nursing professionals seeking better opportunities abroad. The new scheme offers a reliable alternative for those affected.

The discounted items, the Museum of the future, etc. not forgetting the free camel rides, yacht cruise, and an unforgettable quad-biking experience on the desert.

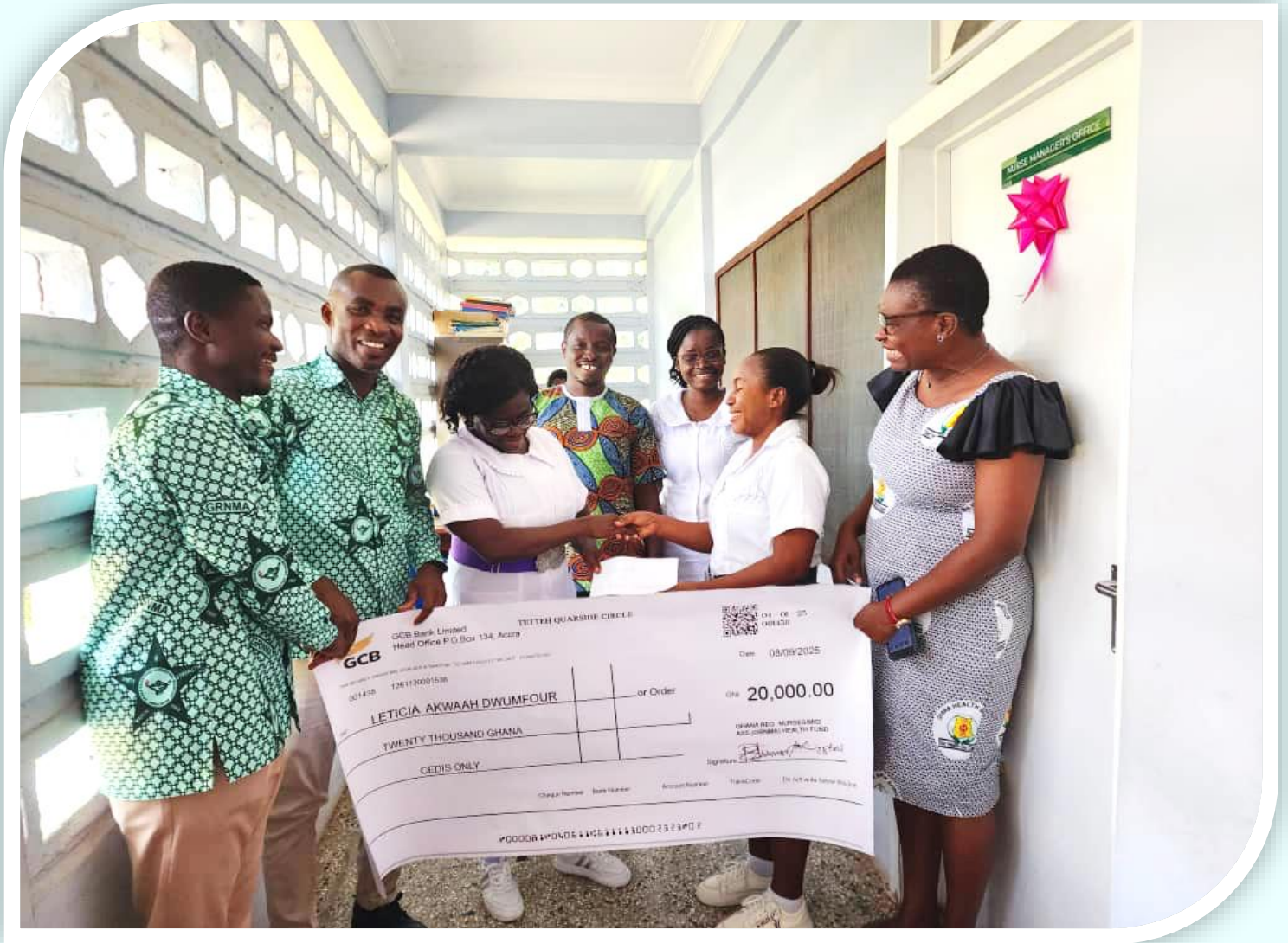

A Hero In The Bush : A Gallant Nurse In The Upper West Region.



A heroic story of courage and compassion from Wa East District in the Upper West Region. Mr. Abdul Latif Iddrisu, a Senior Enrolled Nurse at Gudayiri CHPS and a trained Community Health Officer, saved a mother and her baby during an emergency roadside birth deep in the bush.

While traveling to Wa with a junior colleague, Mr. Latif stopped to help two Fulani men who appeared to have motorcycle trouble. They explained they were escorting a pregnant woman to Wa, but she had urgently stopped to urinate. Recognizing this as a sign of active labor, Mr. Latif rushed to find the woman in distress, with the baby's head already visible.

The men, due to cultural taboos, could not assist in delivering the child. Despite lacking gloves and delivery instruments, Mr. Latif courageously delivered the baby by hand. He sent his colleague to get delivery supplies from a nearby village. When they returned, he improvised, safely clamped and cut the umbilical cord, then transported the mother and newborn to Gudayiri CHPS for further care.

Both mother and baby were stable thanks to his quick thinking and selfless action, breaking cultural barriers to save lives. This act highlights the dedication, professionalism, and heart that nurses like Mr. Latif bring to their communities.

We honor Mr. Abdul Latif Iddrisu and his colleague for their bravery and commitment true heroes serving with courage and compassion. His conduct as an essential service provider is worth recognizing appreciating and applauding, the association is proud of a member, and says "ayeekeo to Latif". The association through the National president reminded government to keep to the agreement in implementing the rural incentives packages for nurses and midwives serving and sacrificing to save lives in hard-to-reach communities.
